FAQs about Bus Trips

- ❖ **How do I sign up for a bus trip?** *By calling the main Transportation line, 978-402-8133. Some trips fill up quickly, so call promptly when you see a bus trip that interests you.*
- ❖ **What if I sign up but then have to cancel?** *Residents who cancel a trip **on the day of the trip** will be charged 50% of the bus fee. If applicable, residents will be charged 100% of a ticket fee if purchased in advance by Newbury Court. **These fees will be charged directly to your account.** Please try to cancel trips well in advance so that residents on waiting lists can be notified appropriately. **To cancel, be sure to once again call Transportation in order to be taken off the trip list.***
- ❖ **May I bring a guest?** *If you wish to invite a guest purely for the company, be aware that seats will be given to Newbury Court residents first, and only if there is room and no waiting list will a guest be given a seat. However, if you require a companion to assist you that person can be given a seat at the time you reserve yours, depending on availability.*
- ❖ **Will you collect the bus fee at the time of the trip?** *All bus fees are charged directly to your account at the end of the month. Note that the bus fee (if any) is listed at the end of the trip description. Admission fees may be collected before or on the day of the trip; please read the specific trip description carefully for clarification.*



Bus Trips

Thursday, May 4, 1:30 PM Trip to Drumlin Farm to see the new offspring in the barns. Our bus will be able to park down in the general area of the barns, but you will need to be able to walk on uneven ground from one barn to the other. We will see the baby lambs, goats, piglets etc. We will spend approx. 1.5 hours there, so you will have time to walk around a bit as well. Senior admission fee is \$6.00. No bus fee.

Mondays, May 8, 15 and 22, 1:00 – 2:30 PM Spring Walks with Cathy and Jill. Cathy Smith and Jill Crowley will lead an hour-long walk at some location in the Concord and Lincoln area within a short bus ride. Possible locations might include Punkatasset, Battle Road, Fairyland and more. Please dress in layers, wear sturdy walking/hiking boots and bring a walking stick if it helps your stability. We have several sets of trekking poles for your use as well, and they make for added exercise *and* stability! Our plan is to return to Newbury Court by 2:30 PM or shortly thereafter. Sign up with transportation **will** be necessary but there is no bus fee.

Friday, May 12, 10:00 AM Trip to Museum of Fine Arts to see *Matisse in the Studio* exhibit. Henri Matisse - who revolutionized 20th-century art - believed that a treasured group of objects was instrumental to his studio practice. "Matisse in the Studio" is the first major international exhibition to examine the importance of Matisse's personal collection of objects, offering unprecedented insight into the great artist's creativity. See these rare pairings of Matisse's major works with objects of inspiration in "Matisse in the Studio" in its only US venue at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. ***For this trip, resident Peter Brooke has generously supplied Programs with VIP passes which admits one to the museum and the Matisse exhibit.*** As always, members get in free. Lunch on your own at the museum. Bus fee \$20.00.

Thursday, May 18, 1:00 PM Trip to Tower Hill Botanic Garden.

An unstructured visit to Boylston's lovely botanical garden. Stroll around the Court, The Cottage Garden, The Lawn Garden, Vegetable Garden and more. There are wooded walking trails, a gift shop, a café and restrooms. We will stay for approx. 1.5 hours. Poor weather cancels. Senior admission fee is \$10.00. Bus fee \$5.00.

Tuesday, May 30, 9:30 AM Trip to Battleship Cove: America's Fleet Museum in Fall River, MA. Battleship Cove is a nonprofit maritime museum and war memorial. Featuring the world's largest collection of World War II naval vessels, it is home to the highly decorated battleship USS Massachusetts. It is located at the heart of the waterfront at the confluence of the Taunton River and Mount Hope Bay and lies partially beneath the Braga Bridge and adjacent to Fall River Heritage State Park. Besides the USS Massachusetts, the museum now has the destroyer USS Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr. and a submarine, the USS Lionfish along with several other ships. Lunch out either onsite or nearby. 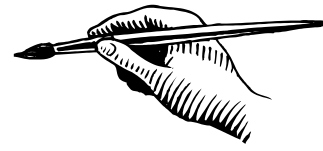

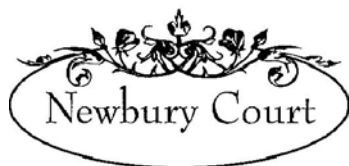
